Andersson (SD) does not rule out uranium mine

- The government wants to open up for Swedish uranium mining or extraction from mining residues, and a proposal is expected to be made public soon.
- So far, Swedish uranium has only been mined in Ranstad in Västergötland, with weak profitability and strong local resistance.
- "If an application is profitable for the company that wants to mine and it complies with all the environmental regulations contained in the legislation, it is free to do so," says Tobias Andersson, SD politician in the Riksdag and in the Skövde council.
